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1. INTRODUCTION

D6.1 Project website: The project website (<u>www.succeed-project.eu</u>) was published on time, in M1 and a short report was sent to the EC in early M2.


D6.2 Dissemination plan for Succeed and for tools, resources and events: The dissemination plan of Succeed was due on M4 and was delivered by early M6.

3. SUCCEED PROJECT WEBSITE AND OTHER DISSEMINATION MEDIA

3.1 Succeed project website



The project website is the main information point for the general public and the stakeholders. There, a general overview of the project and its work packages can be found.

The website is continually updated with particular information about the project, for example:





- the set-up of the Expert Advisory Board;
- the latest project publications (scientific and public deliverables);
- the latest news and events either organized by Succeed or related with digitisation, etc.

Three new sections have been added to the website since its creation:

- 1. Digitisation Days, with information about the main event that Succeed is organizing in May 2014 in Madrid;
- 2. Succeed Awards, including relevant information about these awards;
- 3. EU Proposals Corner that redirects to the EU Proposals section at www.digitisation.eu. This section is part of the Succeed deliverable D7.4 Annual report on the support for the preparation of research proposals and funding opportunities. Despite being a Succeed deliverable, the corner has been created in the Impact Centre of Competence website for a wider dissemination and a longer sustainability since the Centre is envisaged for a longer life.


At the moment of writing this report (January 17th, 2014), the Succeed project website has received 1.508 unique visits (from May 7th, when the analyzer was activated).

In addition to the project website, a parallel site has been created for the DATeCH 2014 (Digital Access to Textual Cultural Heritage – www.datech2014.info) international conference that will be held in the frame of the Digitisation Days and a submission gateway based on EasyChair platform. The DATeCH website has received, since its creation, 1.253 unique visits.

This site gathers all the information about DATeCH such as venue, important dates, submission information, registration, etc.

At the moment of writing, 348 twits have been published by Succeed official account.

4. DISSEMINATION OF TOOLS

In WP3, as part of D3.1 *First online report on available tools*, more than 200 tools for text digitisation and related fields were identified. We have implemented a searching tool based in Apache Solr in order to enhance the usability and accessibility to these tools. In addition, WP3 has created training materials for those tools selected both by internal and external libraries in Succeed as part of their evaluation plan. These materials have been published on the Impact Centre of Competence website (and linked from Succeed website) for improved usability and easier continuous update in HTML and SCORM² formats at http://www.digitisation.eu/training/succeed-training-materials/.




