DIRECTIONS

BU25 offices in Brussels can be reached:

- **By train:** The two main railway stations providing easy links to *Beaulieu* are:
 - *Gare Central* (*Centraal Station*): metro line 5 to *Beaulieu* station (direction *Hermann-Debroux*)
 - *Gare du Midi* (*Zuidstation*): metro line 2 or 6 to *Arts-Loi* station (direction *Simonis Elisabeth*), change to metro line 5 to *Beaulieu* station (direction *Hermann-Debroux*).
- **By plane:** Airport Brussels Zaventem.
 - *Taxi*: approximately €30
 - *Train*: every 20 minutes to *Gare Central* (20-minute journey), then metro to *Beaulieu* (direction *Hermann-Debroux*).
- **By metro:** Take the metro line **5** direction ' *Herrmann-Debroux* '. Get off at ' *Beaulieu* ' station and take the exit marked ' *Avenue de Beaulieu* '. When you have exited the metro, turn left and cross the road at the traffic lights, heading downhill. All the buildings are on the left hand side, starting with no. 33.
- **By car:** Where possible you are recommended to use other means of transport as parking is limited.
