12:00	<p><b><u>International developments &amp; policy issues</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▶ American Chamber of Commerce to the European Union (AmCham EU), Digital Economy Committee - <b>Kalliopi Spyridaki, SAS Manager EU Public Policy</b></li> </ul> <p>Kalliopi Spyridaki manages the EU Public Policy of SAS, the world's largest privately owned software company headquartered in North Carolina, US. In her role, Kalliopi promotes SAS' business interests with respect to EU policies and legislation in areas currently including data protection, healthcare and new technologies. She has been living and working in Brussels since 2002. Kalliopi is a Greek lawyer admitted to the Athens Bar.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▶ Nomura Research Institute – <b>Prof. Makoto Yokozawa, Senior Consultant</b></li> </ul> <p>Dr. Yokozawa is Professor of Joint Reseach Unit at the Graduate School of Informatics in Kyoto University and Senior Consultant at Nomura Research Institute, a private consulting and system integration company in Japan. He has been one of vice chairpersons of BIAC/ICCP, and in OECD, worked as a member of Advisory Expert Groups of "Software Innovation" and "Eco-Innovation and Sustainable Manufacturing" project of OECD/CIIE.</p> <p>His research had been focused on the "Ubiquitous Network Society" for more than 9 years including policy issues like security, privacy, and innovations in industry and society. Also he has been involved in many governmental committees and study groups in Japan.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▶ European Data protection Supervisor – <b>Rosa Barcelo, Legal Adviser</b></li> </ul> <p>Rosa Barcelo is legal adviser to the European Data Protection Supervisor (EDPS). IN this role, Rosa is responsible for advising EU institutions on legal privacy issues related to new technologies. Examples include RFID, issues related to the ePrivacy Directive, behavioural advertisement, and cloud computing. 14:30	<p><b><u>Presentations reporting the findings of the Expert Group</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▶ Overview - <b>Lutz Schubert, HLRS Stuttgart Head of Intelligent Service Infrastructures</b></li> </ul> <p>Lutz Schubert is head of the ISIS research department at the High Performance Computing Centre of the University of Stuttgart. His specific research focus rest on embedding service oriented capabilities for dynamic execution support into low-level resource frameworks - recently he has been investigating specifically into "Clouds-on-a-chip".</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▶ Research – <b>Burkhard Neidecker-Lutz, SAP Technical Director</b></li> </ul> <p>Burkhard Neidecker-Lutz is the Technical Director of SAP Research, overseeing the contents of SAPs Research Portfolio. Prior to SAP he held positions with Compaq and Digital Equipment Corporation. He has worked on multimedia and distributed systems and currently drives the concrete realization of the Internet of Services vision inside SAP.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▶ Policy – <b>Keith Jeffery, President ERCIM &amp; STFC Director</b></li> </ul> <p>Keith Jeffery is currently Director IT and International Strategy, STFC (Science and Technology Facilities Council), based at Rutherford Appleton Laboratory in UK. Keith previously had operational responsibility for IT with 360,000 users, 1100 servers and 140 staff. Keith holds 3 honorary visiting professorships, is a Fellow of the Geological Society of London and the British Computer Society, is a Chartered Engineer and Chartered IT Professional and an Honorary Fellow of the Irish Computer Society.
