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## 1. Executive Summary

This deliverable is the second relating to promotional material created by the Europeana Collections 1914-1918 project, and specifically to the production of a flyer to contextualise and inform general and academic users about the landscape of EU funded 1914-18 projects currently underway.

The deliverable is thus directly informed by the Year One review for the project.

In the review report, in section 1b), it was suggested:

It is also important to establish as soon as possible, through discussions with Europeana about thematic collections, how the 1914-1918 collections, as input to Europeana, will be made visible.

Moreover, in section 2b), we were asked to consider the following:

In the second year, the project may need to concentrate on identifying the needs of all the target groups identified in the Description of Work to define the best way to give access to the content provided by the project and specify the best way that this content can be made visible within the larger collection of Europeana

Accordingly, it was agreed to develop a jointly authored and agreed leaflet to inform users of all the principal 1914-18 projects being funded by the EU, led by our Europeana Collections project under WP4. This was discussed between representatives of the three projects at the Consortium Meeting in Belgrade (October 2012), and the resulting leaflet is attached in Section 2.




## Europeana Remembering World War 1
