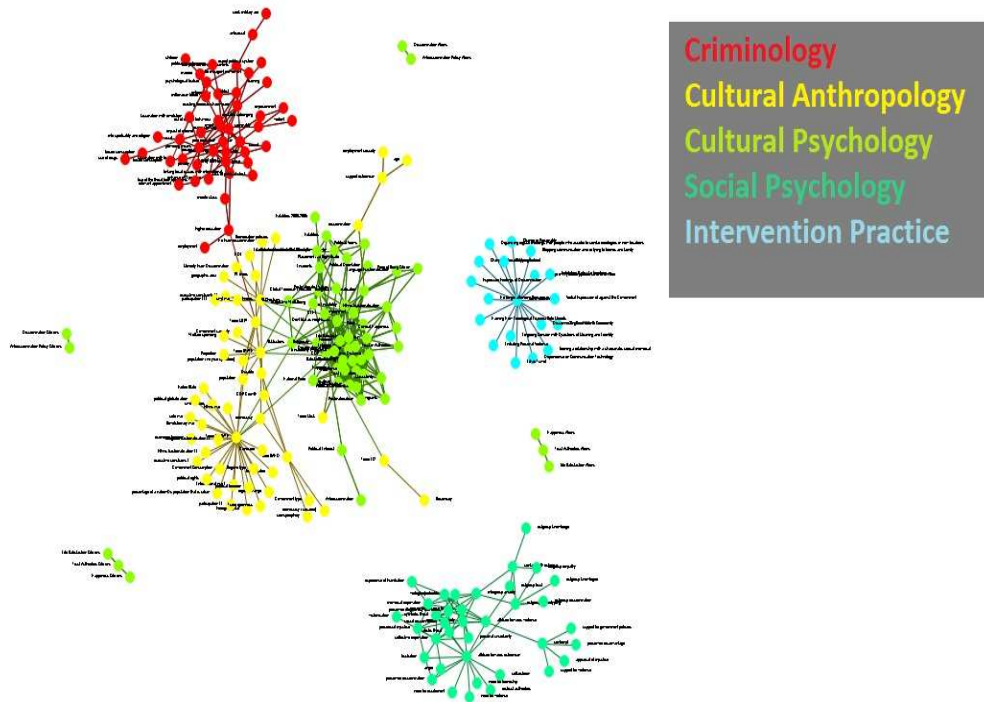
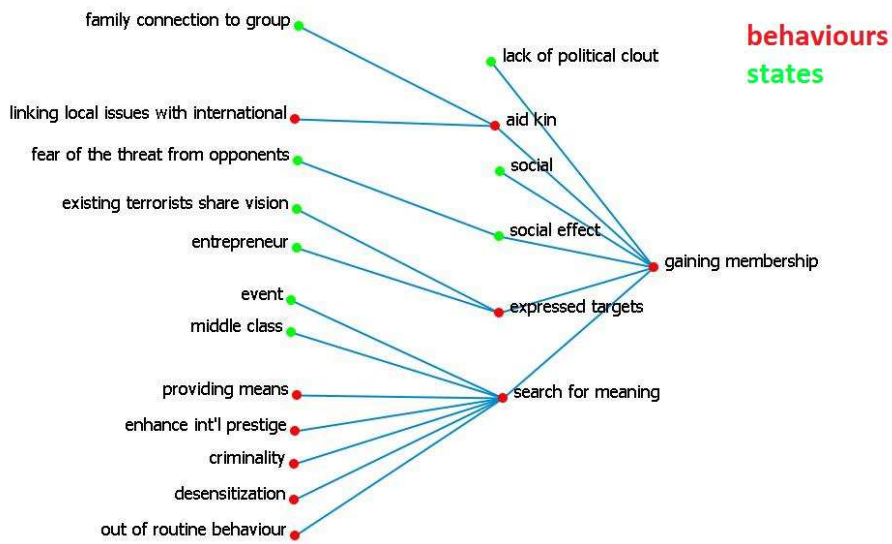


Figure 3. Relational model of factors relating to radicalisation
