Abstract

The Seminar will begin with the screening of some scenes of "Where Strangers Become Neighbours", a documentary film by Leonie Sandercock and Giovanni Attili (2009). In that film an urban community of migrants from different countries, cultures and religions, represents its history, through individual experiences and memories, all linked to the growing in importance and activity of its community centre, in Vancouver. The screening aims to focus the attention on the power of filmed narratives in processes of shared urban projects. The seminar will then discuss the specificity of film language applied to environmental items and its use in urban planning.

Leonardo Cacci is Associate Professor in Town Planning. He lives and works in Venice where he teaches Theories of town planning and urban design at Università IUAV di Venezia, Dipartimento di Progettazione e Pianificazione in ambienti complessi (DPPAC).

Transnational Migrants and Diasporic Territories By Paola Piscitelli

Abstract

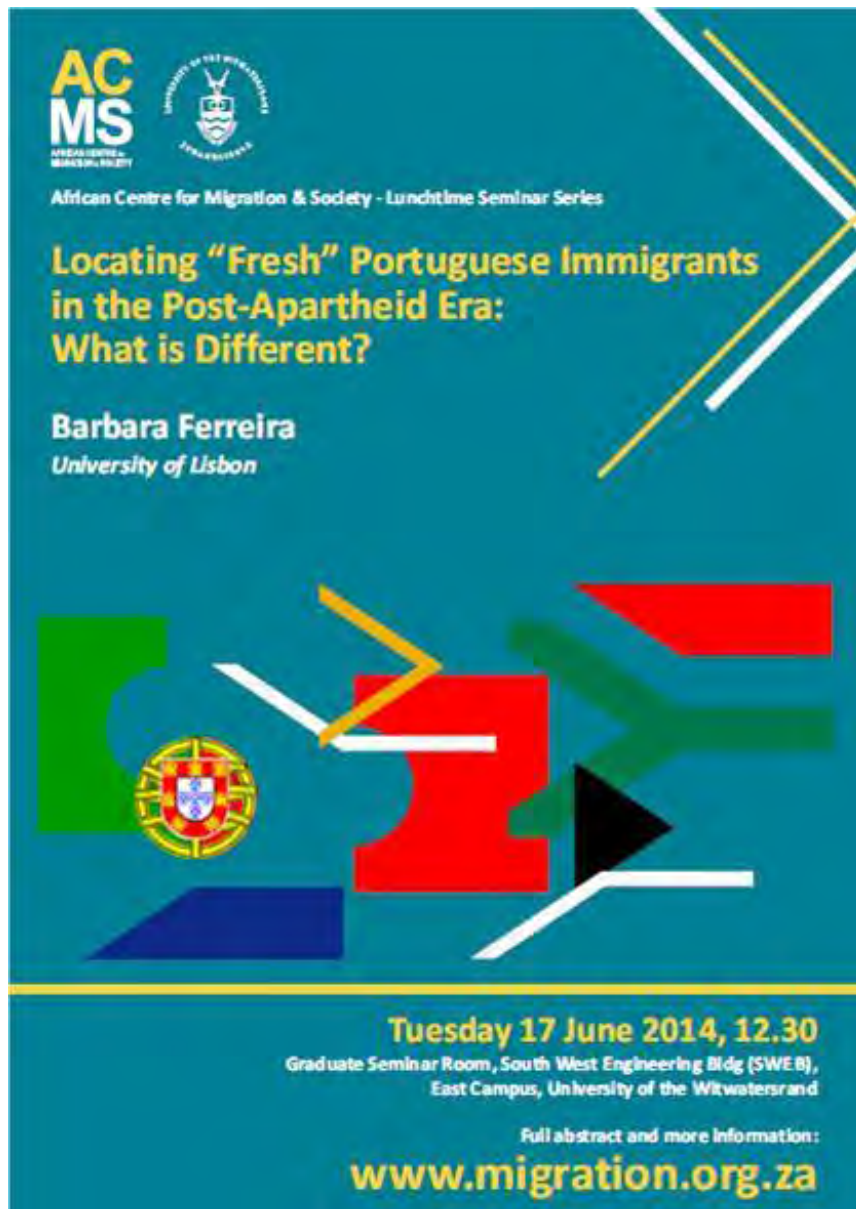
The presentation proposes a reflection on the socio-territorial effects produced by transnational migration in remote areas. In the middle of the crisis of the territories, transnationalism highlights the strong "*glocalisation*" of contemporary migrations, inviting us to carefully consider the interdependencies between global processes and specific cities and regions. Current reflections point to a deepening relationship between migration and co-development and recognise the multiple forms of (social, human, economic) migrants' capital in both communities of origin and destination. The argument is that the action of transnational migrants constitutes a crucial resource for the processes of territorial development and that public policies should be based more on the implementation of devices of permeability of urban practices, capable to endorse migrants as actors of development within transnational geographies.

Paola Piscitelli holds an MSc in Urban Planning and Policy Design from the Politecnico of Milan, recently completed a Masters in Cooperation: Knowledge and Skills for Sustainable cities in the Global South, and is currently a PhD student in Urban and Policy Policies at the University IUAV of Venice. Her research interests include urban policies and practices with particular reference to urban migration issues and informal contexts, co-development, participatory planning and processes of local activation.
